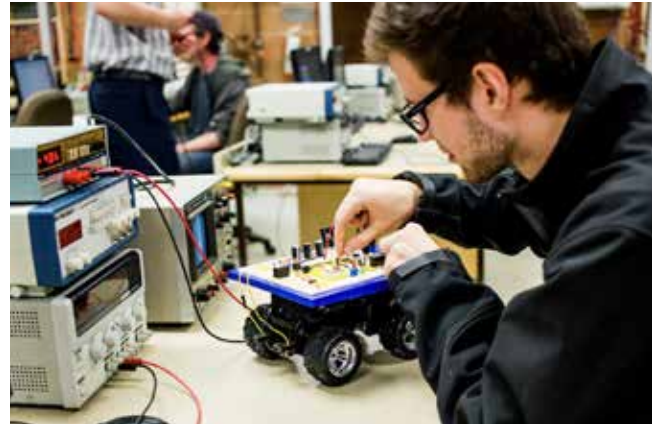

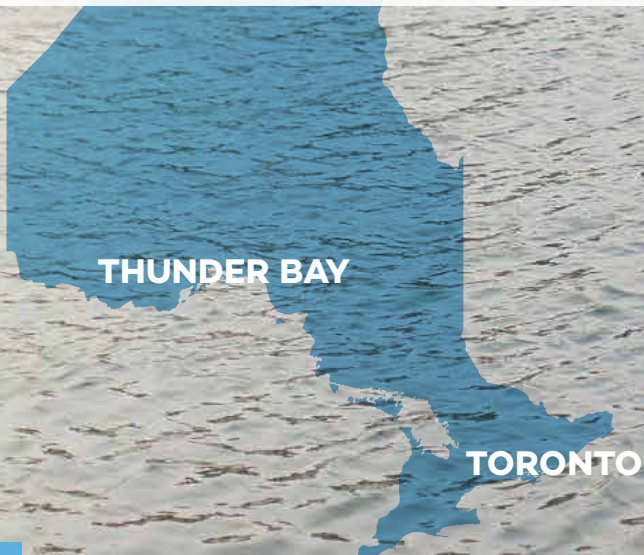

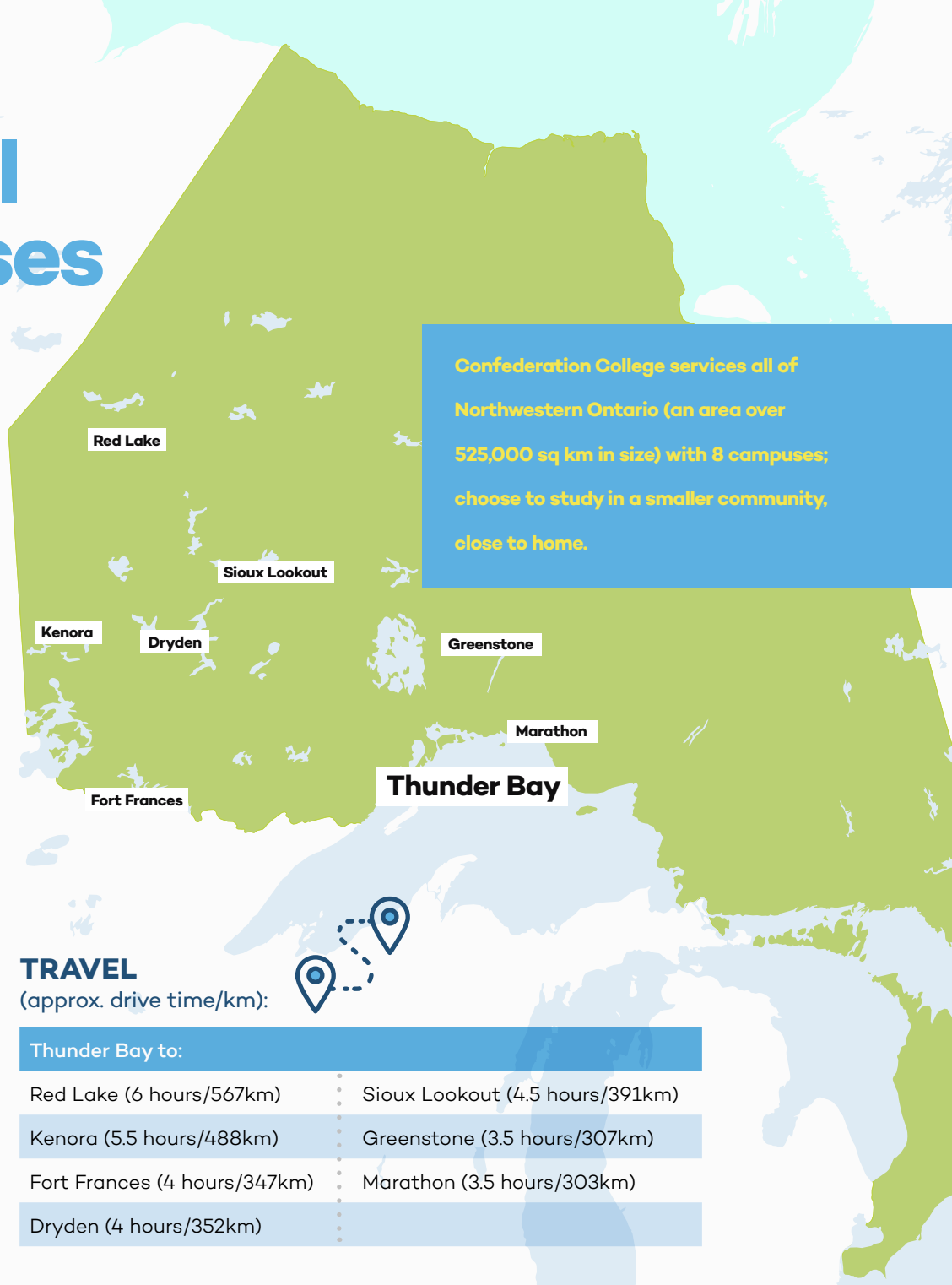

Apprenticeship Programs

There are more than 130 skilled occupations that can be practiced through Ontario's apprenticeship training system. Chefs, educational assistants, plumbers, auto mechanics and welders are all trades that can be defined as "skilled trades," and represent occupations that are integral to the functioning of Ontario's economy.

Apprentices learn a skilled occupation by combining in-school training courses with paid on-the-job training. About 90 per cent of apprenticeship training is provided in the workplace by an employer, while the remainder involves in-school instruction at a training institution like Confederation College.

Apprentices **must** register through the regional apprenticeship office at the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities.

Types of Credentials

OCCP - Ontario College Certificate Programs are two semesters (or one year) of study. Students will gain the knowledge and skills needed to be prepared for entry-level employment and further post-secondary studies.

OCDP - Ontario College Diploma Programs are four semesters (or two years) of study. Students will gain the knowledge, skills and hands-on experience required to work in their field of study and to go on to further post-secondary studies.

OCADP - Ontario College Advanced Diploma Programs are six semesters (three years) of study. Students will build specialized skills through practical application in their field of study.

OCGCP - Ontario College Graduate Certificate Programs are typically two to three semesters of study. Students will gain knowledge and specialized skills built on a foundation of knowledge gained in previous post-secondary study.
